

A sneak peek into Activity-based Learning

The emphasis effective o n classroom learning is vital in student retention. The teachers must adapt to the changing classroom and student needs so that the students enjoy the course and goals. One

such method is Activity-based Learning - a learning process in which students are constantly engaged.

Activity-based Learning is where students actively participate in the learning experience rather than sit as passive listeners. These emphasise that the active learning method differs from the traditional teaching method by the active role and involvement of students in the classrooms and collaboration amongst the students in a



learning environment. These two items are the key to Activity-based Learning and aim to implement a positive learning environment in the classroom.

Activity-based Learning is the baseline for creative and critical thinking skills. However, this

method will only function properly if students are motivated enough to achieve their potential. The most useful and effective method to teach concepts involves students in interactive and different classroom activities; the students' critical thinking and creative skills are also enhanced.

Take us back to your last year's ourney.

The journey started on the first day of class 10th. To achieve good marks, the teacher and student must go hand in hand. The actual hard work taken by teachers motivated me to score good marks. The teaching was excellent, and I was able to understand everything. I also
